

# 2018-19 Budget Initiatives – Justice

- Assistance for victims of crime
  - \$7.2 million over 2 years
- Extending the intermediary scheme to support victims in court
  - \$2.9 million over 2 years (includes \$0.4 million for CSV)
- Increased legal assistance
  - \$37.2 million over 5 years
- Strengthening the Victorian Prosecution Service
  - \$21.9 million over 4 years



# 2018-19 Budget Initiatives – Justice

- Werribee and Bendigo Law Courts redevelopment
  - \$20.0 million
- Prompt and respectful death investigation services
  - \$5.0 million
- Sustainable public advocate services for Victorians with disability
  - \$5.4 million over 2 years



# 2018-19 Budget Initiatives – CSV

- Additional court capacity
  - \$128.9 million over 5 years
- County Court accommodation strategy
  - \$2.6 million
- Echuca Court safety and security
  - \$5.1 million
- Family Drug Treatment Court
  - \$3.9 million
- Strategic asset planning for courts
  - \$3.0 million



#### Achievements - DJR

- Victoria joined the National Redress Scheme for institutional child sexual abuse
- Legal Identity of Defendants (Organisational Child Abuse)
   Bill 2018
- Legislative reforms to improve access to justice
- Commencing Fast Track Mediation at VCAT, to assist more Victorians to resolve consumer disputes more quickly



### Achievements - CSV

- Night Court and new Bail and Remand Court
- Implementation of Specialist family violence integrated court response programs
- Courts case management system
- Court Integrated Services Program (CISP) and CISP Remand Outreach Program (CROP) expansion implementation



### Achievements - CSV

- Access to Justice initiatives implemented across VCAT, Supreme Court and Magistrates' Court
- Melbourne Drug Court
- Expansion of Assessment and Referral Court (ARC) List
- Critical safety and security upgrades for courts across the state

- Reforming Victoria's bail system
- Expansion of Preventative Detention scheme
- Protecting emergency workers
