
- This 2018-19 Victorian Budget invests **\$135.9 million** in early childhood education

Our commitment to early childhood education is demonstrated by our record investment in the portfolio over the past four years




Record investment in kindergarten infrastructure

Ready for kinder – capital and scholarships

Investing in more kindergarten infrastructure and a high quality workforce.

\$42.9 million

will fund:

- new and upgraded existing early learning facilities and integrated children's centres
- additional kindergarten places
- expand early childhood services across Victoria to meet demand pressures
- co-locate early learning centres on three government primary school sites



For new scholarships to attract new teachers, and support educators to get a teaching qualification





Ready for school – School Readiness Funding

This is a new, permanent part of the Victorian kindergarten system

Ready for life – Language programs

We want to help children prepare for an increasingly interconnected world



specialist language program:

- specialist teachers funded to deliver language classes in up to **120 kinders**
- more than **3,000 children** learning a language other than English
- another 10 kinders become bilingual.





Giving every child, every chance

Providing additional support for some children and families



in funding will:

- help meet growing demand for the Early Start Kindergarten Program
- expand **LOOKOUT** program to kindergartens for the first time and for children in Out of Home Care



Continue and expand Maternal and Child Health services tailored for Aboriginal families

\$900,000

in funding for **Early Childhood Intervention Services** to support children ineligible for the NDIS
