


### **Investment in Energy, Environment and Climate Change**

Our last four state budgets have delivered unprecedented investment, with almost \$1.6 billion in new funding approved, including record investment from the Sustainability Fund of over \$600 million.

The 2018-19 budget builds on this investment by providing an additional \$257 million.

#### **2018-19 Budget Highlights**

\$104.4 million to protect our Natural Environment

### \$104.4 million to protect our natural environment for generations of Victorians including:

- \$3.0 million to protect our Faunal Emblems
- \$3.0 million to complete the master plan and finalise the land tenure arrangements for the Patterson River precinct

### \$25.9 million to protect Victorians from waste and pollution

- \$14.5 million Recycling Industry Assistance package
- \$9.1 million for the continuation of the Illegal Dumping Strikeforce
- \$2.2 million to Protect People and the Environment from Hazardous Waste

### \$5.8 million to ensure Victoria continues as a leader on climate change




#### We have also delivered on our commitments

- Commenced construction of two large scale batteries, as part of the Victorian Government's energy storage initiative
- Improved emergency response capability in Western Victoria with the opening of a new incident control centre at Horsham
- Launch of the first interactive app 'More to Explore' to help Victorians get out and explore our forests
- Release of 2018 round of Community and Volunteer Action
   Grants, to help protect the future of Victoria's biodiversity
- Delivering on the significant investment of \$273.3 million made in the 2017-18 Budget for the 'Reducing Bushfire Risk initiative'




### Management of bushfires – fuel management in 2017-18 (to date)

- 358 burns 64,978 ha treated
- Mechanical works 9,750 ha
- 43 of 71 high priority risk reduction burns completed.
- Preliminary 2018 residual risk estimated to be 65%


### Autumn 2018 – warm with below average rainfall

- State rainfall 39.2% below average (lowest since 2008)
- Temperature 1.2 degrees above average (4<sup>th</sup> warmest on record)



#### **Traditional burns and Aboriginal Fire Management**

- Local partnerships created between Traditional Owners and land management authorities
- Seven traditional burns scheduled in the Loddon Mallee region







#### **Stawell tyre stockpile**

- Assessed as presenting the greatest risk in Victoria with catastrophic social, environmental and economic impacts
- In the period 9 August 2017 to 16 October 2017, the EPA successfully removed approximately 1 million tyres (9,500 tonnes) from the site
- EPA have commenced legal proceedings to recover costs of the clean up from the duty holder
