



VICTORIA'S ECONOMIC GROWTH WAS STRONGEST IN 2015




STRONGEST EMPLOYMENT GROWTH OF ALL STATES IN 2015






VICTORIA'S POPULATION GROWTH REMAINS STRONG








MAJOR PROJECTS FULLY FUNDED

THE EDUCATION STATE

Biggest ever capital investment in our schools

Over \$924 million for classrooms and schools, including:

\$287 million for new schools and land, including many in growth areas

\$385 million to restore worn-down schools

\$64 million to alleviate over-crowded classrooms

\$92 million to establish tech schools across the state

\$50 million to create community hubs in growth areas

 Additional \$200 million allocated to maintain school facilities from existing DET funds



RECORD BOOST TO HEALTH

Investing in a health system that Victorians can rely on

The 2016-17 Budget provides \$982 million for new and upgraded health facilities, infrastructure and vital health equipment, including:

- \$200 million for the Regional Health Infrastructure Fund that will enhance the quality and amenity of rural and regional health services
- \$169 million for the redevelopment of Goulburn Valley Health at Shepparton
- \$135 million additional contribution to the Victorian Heart Hospital
- \$102 million investment to refurbish infrastructure at the Austin, Footscray and Sunshine Hospital sites
- \$70 million to replace medical equipment, engineering infrastructure and clinical services hardware across Victoria




NEW ROAD AND PUBLIC TRANSPORT INFRASTRUCTURE

This Budget will transform our public transport system, reduce road congestion and improve safety for everyone

- \$2.9 billion new infrastructure investment in public transport
 - \$960 million in regional public transport including the Ballarat rail upgrade and more regional trains
 - \$1.9 billion in metropolitan public transport including the Mernda rail extension project,
 Hurstbridge Corridor Upgrade and 28 more high capacity metro trains
- Fully funding the Melbourne Metro Tunnel and Western Distributor
- \$6.7 billion new infrastructure investment in roads
 - \$1.46 billion Government contribution over four years to Western Distributor
 - \$646 million for metropolitan road upgrades that were election commitments as well as an additional package for the outer suburbs
 - \$510 million for road improvements in regional Victoria


