

- The 2016-17 Budget invests \$167.3 million in vital early childhood initiatives
- Our first two budgets have more than doubled the average additional investment

Strong early years services

- \$10 million to build early childhood facilities in growth areas and for improved planning across the state
- \$4.4 million to support small kindergartens in rural areas
- \$3.8 million for the National Occasional Care Programme



Modernising Maternal and Child Health

- \$133 million for vital maternal and child health services
 - Largest ever investment in MCH
 - Includes \$2.1 million to help centres communicate more effectively with parents, including CALD families
- \$1.6 million to co-design more culturally responsive, high-quality maternal and child health services for Aboriginal families





Funding boost to re-shape services and improve lives for vulnerable families and children and address family violence





- **31 per cent** increase in funding for child protection and family services over two years compared to the 2014-15 Budget
 - 12 per cent increase in funding for child protection and family services compared to the 2015-16 Budget
 - 17 per cent increase in 2015-16 for child protection and family services compared to the 2014-15 Budget

- \$168 million for Roadmap for Reform, including:
 - \$32.3 million to boost intensive support early in life

DHHS and DET to jointly develop a new intensive in-home early childhood support service

\$16.5 million for supporting Aboriginal children and families

Specialist family violence support

- \$572 million across Government to begin implementation of the Royal Commission into Family Violence recommendations
- In my portfolio, this includes:
 - \$25.4 million allocated to therapeutic interventions
 - \$8.3 million for changing perpetrator behaviour
 - \$1.8 million for access to financial counselling

- \$19.9 million to support children, young people and families in need with integrated wraparound supports and targeted earlier interventions, including:
 - \$8.5 million for therapeutic interventions for vulnerable children
 - \$5.7 million for integrated family services
 - \$5.8 million for child protection workers

Roadmap for Reform – strong families, safe children Out of Home Care

- \$100 million to provide safe and secure living in home-based care in a stable home, including:
 - \$16.2 million to increase support for carers
 - \$34.2 million to grow home based care
 - \$35.9 million to improve the quality of out-of-home care support
 - \$1 million to improve the sexual health of children in out-of-home care
 - \$9.4 million for out-of-home care stock replacements and renewal
 - \$2.3 million for urgent and essential residential care maintenance

Youth Justice

- \$10.1 million to reduce youth offending by intervening early
 - \$5.6 million for a state-wide youth diversion program in the Children's Court
 - More than \$1 million to expand the Youth Justice Bail Supervision Program
 - \$3.3 million to strengthen secure services
