
Secure Water Future

\$468 million invested in:

- Sustainable water management
- Infrastructure
- Irrigation (including \$20 million from the Agriculture Infrastructure and Jobs Fund)

\$31 million also invested in a range of programs including: Hazelwood response, Port Phillip Environment Fund, Liveability Victoria International

Drivers for Investment – Climate Change

- The Victorian Government is committed to restoring Victoria's status as a leader and model for other states in tackling climate change.
- DELWP leads the Victorian Government's commitment to reinvigorate climate change action within the state.
 - Key reform priorities include:
 - o Independent Review of the Climate Change Act 2010
 - Development of a ClimateChange Framework
 - Long term emissions reduction target
 - Victoria's second adaptationplan

Budget Response – Climate Change

• \$128 million to tackle climate change and prepare our communities and industries for the future.

• \$400 million for water infrastructure and programs



Coasts and Climate Change Innovation

• \$30.1 million to upgrade coastline infrastructure, beach renourishment and manage the impacts of climate change on our coastline

Waste

• **\$21 million** to create jobs and drive innovation in the waste and resource recovery sector




Biodiversity

- \$33 million to tackle weeds and pests and targeted on-ground actions
- **\$0.4 million** to protect the Helmeted Honeyeater
- \$21.1 million to support the activities and volunteers of Landcare and Trust for Nature



Sustainability Fund

- 2015-16 was the highest ever single year allocation from the Sustainability Fund (\$42 million).
- This will be surpassed by the \$41 million in new funding provided in 2016-17 for waste, biodiversity, climate change and energy efficiency initiatives which when added to the existing spend results in a total 2016-17 spend of \$53 million.
- This is in comparison to investment over the prior four years where less than \$10 million in new funding was allocated



Tourism and Parks

- \$48.2 million for a major upgrade of the Visitor Centre at Phillip Island Nature Parks' Penguin Parade
- **\$20 million** for Parks Victoria, including funding over four years to revitalise infrastructure


Bushfire response

\$74 million invested to keep Victorians safe from the threat of bushfires and provided resources for extended fire seasons (October to May)

- Increased project fire fighters across the state
- A digital upgrade to radio communications
- More aerial surveillance and helicopter detection activities
- Improving the safety of our fire fighters




Secure Water Future

A healthy environment underpins our communities and a productive economy.

However, most of our water resources are already at their sustainable limits and climate change is placing pressure on our water resources.

Investing in our water sector will strengthen our growing regional economies and communities and help Victoria respond to growing global markets.



Secure Water Future


\$468 million invested to improve water security including:

- **\$222 million** to improve the health of waterways and catchments
- \$59.6 million to support irrigation modernisation projects
- \$33 million to invest in practical programs that improve how we use Victoria's water
- **\$25 million** to prepare Victorians for floods



Secure Water Future

- \$16.3 million to upgrade the Werribee and Bacchus Marsh irrigation districts
- \$41.4 million to connect south-west Loddon Shire with Victoria's water grid
- \$14.1 million in additional funding to deal with rising groundwater in Bendigo
- \$30 million to provide Nyora, Loch, Korumburra and Poowong with a secure water supply



Environmental Contributions

- The 2016-17 State Budget represents the total allocation of EC Tranche 3 with the final \$60 million outstanding as of last year's State budget allocated to projects.
- Tranche 4 has been established with revenue of \$539 million over four years to be collected. \$394.2 million has been allocated to specific initiatives and \$144.8 million has been set aside subject to finalisation of Water for Victoria.
- As detailed in the graph below all revenue to be collected in the first two years of tranche 4 has already been acquitted.
