



The Department's actual expenditure for 2016-17 was \$13 billion












Victorian school aged population – 5 to 17 years old


Victoria's NAPLAN results for 2017 show some promising signs:

 An upward shift in the proportion of students in the top three bands in all year levels of Reading and Numeracy indicates that student performance is beginning to lift




 This is also evidenced through an upward shift in the proportion of students in the top two bands of NAPLAN in Year 3 and year 7 Reading and Numeracy.










Change in government-funded students by TAFE institutes, Dual Sector and other government providers (Jan-Jun 2016 to Jan-Jun 2017)
