

## Questions taken on notice and further information agreed to be supplied by the Department of Premier and Cabinet

### 2015–16 Financial and Performance Outcomes Hearing – 16 February 2017

1. What was the expenditure in 2015-16 on the role the member for Footscray is performing for the Premier? When was the member for Footscray appointed as special adviser to the Premier?

*(Page 5 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

Consistent with the Government's *Guidelines for Official Ministerial Overseas Travel* all Ministers, including the Premier, must publish travel outcomes reports on their relevant departmental website within 60 working days of the Minister's return. The expenses of the Member for Footscray, in her role as special adviser to the Premier, are incorporated in the figures contained in the Premier's travel outcome reports available on DPC's website.

DPC does not have oversight of appointment of special advisers to the Premier, and therefore is not aware of the date of the appointment of the Member for Footscray.

2. Other than the refurbishment of the Special Minister of State's office, have there been any other substantial refurbishments of ministerial or parliamentary secretary offices in 2015-16?

*(Page 8 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

Other than the refurbishment of the Special Minister of State's office, DPC undertook no substantial refurbishments of offices for its Ministers or Parliamentary Secretaries in 2015-16.

3. What advice or what role did DPC have in relation to the Trade Union Royal Commission (TURC)? Were any officers monitoring the hearings or the evidence given through that process? Did DPC prepare any advice for the Premier or any other parts of government relating to TURC either before or after it reported and also including the former Government Whip in the upper house, Mr Melham, or the Premier's industrial relations adviser, Mr Joh-Paul Blandthorn?

*(Pages 8-9 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

DPC undertook its customary advisory role to the Premier in relation to the Trade Union Royal Commission (TURC).

Specifically DPC received advice from:

- Industrial Relations Victoria (within the Department of Economic Development, Jobs, Transport and Resources) regarding the contents of the final report and the implications

for Victoria of the recommendation that all jurisdictions consider adopting a national approach to the registration, deregistration and regulation of employee and employer organisations, with a single regulator overseeing all such organisations throughout Australia; and

- the Victorian Government Solicitor's Office regarding the TURC's terms of reference and the scope of the TURC's powers.

DPC is not aware of any monitoring by staff of the hearings or other evidence collection processes.

DPC prepared three briefing documents for the Premier on the contents of:

- the interim report (during the three days leading up to its public release)
- the final report (after its public release); and
- the confidential volume (that was not publicly released).

DPC is not aware of any advice provided to Mr Melham or Mr Blandthorn.

4. What was the total amount paid by the department to promote the Premier's Facebook page in 2015-16?

*(Page 9 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

The costs associated with Facebook advertising are charged directly to the Premier's Office and met from its annual appropriation. Total spend for 2015-16 was \$122,507.

5. Can you provide the committee with the Facebook advertising records for 2015-16 which includes the campaign, the amount spent and the interaction?

**Response:**

6. Please provide the committee with a list of figures for each departmental project paid for another minister which has been subject to the department for Facebook promotion in 2015-16. Can you also provide a breakdown for each agency and department and the costs of Facebook advertising charged to the taxpayer?

**Response:**

All advertising expenditure information related to the Premier's Facebook page is included in the transaction spreadsheet referred to at Question 5. The expenditure is from the Premier's Office appropriation.

7. Of the support the Leader of the Opposition received from the DPC appropriation, was any of that spent on communications, whether it be social media or the postal service?

*(Page 10 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

- \$7,234 Communications (Advertising) which includes \$381 Social media spend.
- \$45 Postage.

8. In 2015-16 the estimate for ministerial staff costs was \$26.6 million. What was the actual figure?

*(Page 12 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

In 2015–16 the actual figure for ministerial staff was \$29.5 million.

9. As of June 2015 in the office of the Premier and ministerial offices there were 21 chiefs of staff, six ministerial directors and 175 ministerial staff and zero casual staff. What are the figures as of June 2016 for these different roles?

*(Page 12 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

As of June 2016 in the Office of the Premier and ministerial offices there were 20 chiefs of staff, 10 ministerial directors, 187 ministerial staff and 2 casual staff.

10. Apart from the ministerial staff, ministers and the member for Footscray, does anyone else have access to a minstaff email address and if so for what purpose?

*(Page 12 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

Allocation of minstaff email addresses is undertaken by the Office of the Premier.

Minstaff email addresses are provided to DPC employees who are Ministerial Drivers and Departmental Liaison Officers to facilitate efficient office communications.

11. The DPC annual report on page 68 states that under the category 'Supplies and services', that the purchase of services went up from \$32 million in the previous year to \$40 million in 2015-16 and IT services went up from nearly \$8 million to nearly \$11 million. Why have these two items increased so much?

*(Page 14 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

The \$8 million increase under the category 'Supplies and Services' was mainly due to costs incurred by Service Victoria (\$6.5 million) and costs incurred in relation to the Royal Commission into Family Violence and Hazelwood Coal Mine Fire Inquiry.

IT Services increase is mainly due to DPC Desktop Transformation IT Project which resulted in the roll-out of notebook computers across DPC (\$2.3 million).

12. What was the success rate of the Back to Work contract?

*(Page 17 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

The VECCI call out program was conducted between 1 March 2016 and 8 June 2016 and 7,596 businesses were contacted through the call-out program.

Take up for the exact period of the contract is not available as the SRO reported claims on a quarterly basis.

The SRO Back to Work quarterly reports show an increase in take up between quarters as follows:

- From 1 January to 31 March 2016 4,282 payments were made.
- From 1 April to 30 June 2016, 10,310 payments were made.

13. Please provide a headline of the back to Work contract to the Committee.

*(Page 17 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

VECCI were contracted to raise awareness of the Back to Work Scheme via a call out program to 7,500 employers, accompanied by social media activities, articles in the Victorian Chamber Business magazine and links on the VECCI website.

14. Did the State Revenue Office receive any kind of attacks or fraudulent applications for the Back to Work scheme?

15. How many Opposition staff were allocated on 1 July 2015 and again on 30 June 2016, including casual staff? What were the non-staff costs for the Opposition leader's office?

- As at 1 July 2015 16.60 FTE were allocated to the Opposition leader's office.
- As at 1 July 2016 16.40 FTE were allocated to the Opposition leaders' office.
- The non-staff costs for the office were \$148,412.

16. Were there any office refurbishments for the opposition in the 2015-16 period? Could you please provide the gender breakdowns for the Leader of the Opposition and his office and the opposition offices during the 2015-16 period? How many cars from the driver's pool were allocated to the opposition and for whom were they allocated?

**Response:**

DPC undertook no refurbishments of the Office of the Opposition in the 2015-16 period.

DPC has no information in relation to the gender breakdown of the staff of the Leader of the Opposition.

DPC has allocated four vehicles to the Opposition being the:

- Leader of the Opposition
- President of the Legislative Council
- Leader of the Opposition in the Legislative Council
- Deputy Leader of the Opposition.

17. Please provide the Committee with a copy of the legal advice on the merits of the matter referred to the Ombudsman by the Legislative Council on 25 November 2015. If this request for information is refused, please indicate why that decision was taken.

DPC refers to the Special Minister of State's letter to the Chair of the Public Accounts and Estimates Committee dated 1 March 2017.

18. What was the budget and cost of the behavioural economics unit in DPC in 2015-16? Who heads up the unit?

*(Pages 22-23 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

On 19 August 2015, the Victorian Secretaries Board committed to provide \$1.25 million annually for two years (\$2.5 million total) to establish the Victorian Behavioural Insights Unit. The funding comes from within existing departmental resources.

The Behavioural Insights Unit commenced operations in June 2016. Expenditure for 2015-16 financial year was \$5,000.

The Behavioural Insights Unit is headed up by Sam Hannah-Rankin, Director, Public Sector Innovation.

19. What proportion of the \$25 million allocated to establish the Research Institute on Social Cohesion and \$600,000 allocated through community resilience grants, has been allocated to emerging violent extremism and the involvement of some youth from multicultural backgrounds? What is the total cost of the operations of the social cohesion and community resilience task force and of the whole-of-government reference group? What are the KPIs of the unit?

*(Pages 26-27 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

As of February 2017, 47 per cent of total Social Cohesion and Community Resilience Ministerial Taskforce (the Taskforce) funding was allocated to early intervention with individuals, particularly youth, who may be drawn to violent extremism.

However, all of the work of the Taskforce directly or indirectly supports early intervention. For example:

- the Social Cohesion Research Grants program is funding research that will provide an evidence base to increase understanding of the factors that attract young people to violent extremism and will inform the design of effective early intervention initiatives; and
- the Community Resilience Grants program is supporting and working with communities and young people at risk of violent extremism to develop their confidence and skills to advocate for their concerns and grievances through peaceful, democratic means.

The Taskforce has approved an allocation of up to \$950,000 per annum for staffing and administrative costs for the Community Resilience Unit (CRU), which oversees the delivery of the Taskforce's work. Support for the whole-of-government Countering Violent Extremism Reference Group is provided by the CRU within the Multicultural Affairs and Social Cohesion Division. The small operational cost associated with staff time to support this group is absorbed within the overall CRU staffing and administrative budget.

The *Strategic Framework to Strengthen Victoria's Social Cohesion and the Resilience of its Communities* details the principles and objectives that underpin the Taskforce's work.

20. With regards to the grants program for multicultural affairs and citizenship, who administers the grants and who determines their allocation?

*(Page 27 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

The Multicultural Affairs and Social Cohesion (MASC) division administers the delivery of the multicultural affairs grants program in conjunction with the Victorian Multicultural Commission (VMC).

The steps for determining allocation of grants are as follows:

- Primary assessment by program contract managers (DPC staff)
- External panel assessment and funding allocation (panel typically includes VMC, Departmental and external representation with relevant expertise to the grant program)
- Internal executive review of proposed funding allocation
- VMC ratification
- Ministerial approval.

**Response:**

- The total expenditure that the Minister for the Prevention of Family Violence was responsible for in 2015-16, excluding the cost of the Royal Commission, was \$3.9 million. This included funding for:
  - Maintaining Victoria's momentum and expertise in prevention while the Royal Commission into Family Violence was underway
  - Supporting national research and prevention infrastructure
  - Women's health prevention projects
  - Victoria against Violence – 16 days of activism.



26. Please provide the Committee with the annual reporting on the financial records for the Framlingham Aboriginal Trust for 2015-16.

*(Page 36 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

The Framlingham Aboriginal Trust (Trust) is yet to hold their 2015-16 Annual General Meeting (AGM). The Trust wrote to the Minister on 1 February 2017 stating their 2015-16 Audited Financial Statements (AFS) have not been finalised by their appointed Auditor. The Framlingham Committee of Management is therefore unable to sign off the 2015-16 AFS and as such is unable to hold 2015-16 AGM. Once the Trust has held their 2015-16 AGM, DPC will provide the Committee with a copy of the 2015-16 AFS.

27. Under the Aboriginal Lands Act, the balance sheets and profit and loss information should be made available to anyone who wants to see them. Can you please provide these balance sheets for 2015-16?

**Response:**

The *Aboriginal Lands Act 1970* (Section 24AA(2)) requires that the most recent balance-sheet and profit and loss account must be available for inspection on request by any person during ordinary business hours. Once it becomes available DPC will request and provide a copy to the Committee.

28. What was the state government funding for the Framlingham Aboriginal Trust in 2015-16?

*(Page 37 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

In 2015-16, DPC funded the Framlingham Aboriginal Trust (Trust) \$241,244 for the delivery of Municipal and Essential Services. The total State Government funding provided to the Trust will be known upon finalisation of the 2015-16 AFS.

29. What action is the department and the government taking to ensure that taxpayers funds are being protected with respect to the Framlingham Aboriginal Trust?

*(Page 37 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

The Framlingham Aboriginal Trust (Trust) receives Victorian government funds through the Victorian Common Funding Agreement (VCFA). This agreement is used across the Victorian government and includes standard terms and conditions. Agreed accountability requirements between DPC and the Trust include quarterly financial and progress reports. Financial reports include bank reconciliation, income and expenditure and a certified audited financial report. DPC monitors the Trust's performance by desktop and on-site audits throughout the life of the VCFA to ensure that the Trust meets its obligations under the VCFA.

30. How many of the recommendations from the *Always was, always will be Koori children* report have been implemented?

*(Page 38 of the Department of Premier and Cabinet transcript)*

**Response:**

The Government has accepted in full, in part or in principle 76 of the 79 recommendations directed to Government in the *Always was, always will be Koori children* report. As at 27 February 2017, two of the recommendations have been implemented and work is underway on a number of others. A subcommittee of the Aboriginal Children's Forum has been established to monitor implementation of the recommendations. The subcommittee, consisting of key stakeholder representatives, met for the first time on 27 February 2017 and will meet again on 24 March 2017 to receive a progress update on the implementation of the recommendations.

Note that committed vs actual payments varies for a range of reasons. These include: Multiyear commitments are captured as being allocated in 2015-16, but will be paid out over the life of the multiyear commitment (including in 2015-16); delays in acceptance, processing and payment; and payments being withheld when made on a conditional basis until conditions are met. Both figures have been presented to capture the PAEC request for cumulative amount, and allocation.

The total amount allocated to Senior organisations in the 2015-16 financial year was \$1,276,346 which is made up of four separate products.

\*\* Multi year funding provides organisations with greater financial stability, allowing for forward planning; and may enable groups to better leverage support from other sources, increasing the longer-term sustainability and growth of their activities. It also reduces the administrative burden for both the administrators and the grant recipients.

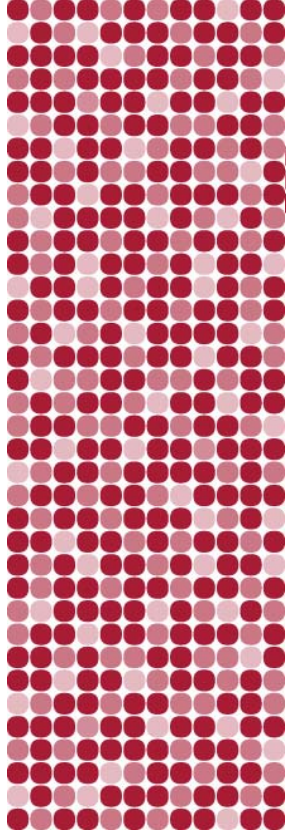

## Introduction

Victoria is a colourful and diverse community, made up from many different cultures from around the world. From the traditional Aboriginal custodians, European settlers and Asian immigrants who came to Victoria in its gold rush days, to the newly arrived Australians from Africa and the Middle East, this diversity provides the Victorian community its vibrancy, rich culture and history.

Through the acceptance of successive waves of migration, Victoria has subsequently been positioned as the most multicultural state in Australia. As time has progressed, new arrivals have changed the makeup of our society, introducing new cultures, languages, religions and faiths.

Our long history of being a welcoming home to new migrants, including many professionals, tradespeople and business migrants has assisted us to develop talent and address skill shortages in many industries and sectors.

This DPC Cultural Diversity and Inclusion Strategy 2015 – 2018 builds upon the established foundation of diversity through the Departments Aboriginal Inclusion Action Plan 2014 and the Disability Action Plan 2014. This strategy is focused on how we, continue to build our diversity within the department. In doing so, we seek to ensure that we are a department which is representative of the State of Victoria and its rich cultural and diverse history.

## Our Vision for Cultural Diversity

### Vision

*“To build a culturally diverse and inclusive work environment and ensure our policy advice is inclusive of diverse perspectives to achieve good public policy and service delivery outcomes for Victorians.”*

### Goals

To achieve this vision, our goals are:

**Goal 1:** Increased understanding and respect of Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) communities.

**Goal 2:** Increased participation and engagement between DPC and CALD communities.

**Goal 3:** Increased CALD employment and economic participation.

**Goal 4:** Established frameworks for reporting, accountability and measuring success.

### Supporting Policy Documents

To support us to achieve our vision, DPC will draw upon the following Victorian Government policy documents:

- **The Multicultural Victoria Act 2011** recognises in its preamble that one of the central tenets of multiculturalism is citizenship and that the expression citizenship is not limited to formal Australian citizenship, but refers to the rights and responsibilities of all people in a multicultural society.
- **The Equal Opportunity Act 2010** encourages the identification and elimination of discrimination, sexual harassment and victimisation and their causes, and promotes and facilitates the progressive realisation of equality.
- **Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities Act 2006** enshrines civil and political rights, and some cultural rights into Victorian law. Victoria is the first Australian state to enact formal protection of human rights by introducing a Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities, with the Charter ensuring human rights are valued and protected within government and the community.



- **Racial and Religious Tolerance Act 2001** provides a community standard about our responsibility towards each other in a multicultural society, seeking to ensure that people are treated with dignity and respect, regardless of their particular race or religion.
- **Victoria's Advantage Unity Diversity Opportunity Policy** recognises that each of us plays a part in contributing to and shaping the future of our State, and that by valuing and embracing our diversity, we can continue to realise the benefits of a cohesive and multicultural society.

## Principles

In achieving the objectives of the Cultural Diversity and Inclusion Strategy 2015 - 2018, DPC will be guided by the departmental values of:

*Leadership – We lead by example.* We strive to create positive and productive working relationships. Our leaders will role model behaviours designed to promote the full inclusion of all Victorians within DPC.

*Integrity – We work to serve the public good.* We uphold the ideals of openness and honesty, and stand by what we believe is right. DPC and its staff are accountable for our actions to ensure the success of this plan.

*Collaboration – We are team players.* We seek, encourage and value the contribution and skills of the people with whom we work, recognising that we have an important role to play in the inclusion of all Victorians.
