**The following motion was agreed to in the House:**

- That Standing Order 7.06 be suspended so as to enable the consideration of the Planning Legislation Amendment Bill 2009 (No. 2), which Bill contains provisions the same in substance to those originally rejected by the Council during this current Session.

**Notices were given of the following motions:**

- **MS PENNICUIK** — To move, That this House calls on the Government to abandon plans for the construction of the Peninsula Link or Frankston Bypass and instead implement alternative, local and less costly solutions to reduce bottlenecks and peak time congestion on existing arterial roads and upgrade public transport services in Frankston and the Mornington Peninsula.
- **MR D.M. DAVIS** — To move, That this House —
  - (1) condemns the Minister for Health for failing to inform the House of the 108,327 Victorians who are on the Government's own dental waiting list, while he was attempting to make claims about his achievements; and
  - (2) notes that the State Budget shows the targeted 314,700 patients to be treated for this financial year is in fact an estimated 6,000 fewer patients than were treated in 2007-08.
- **MRS PEULICH** — To move, That this House condemns the Bracks/Brumby Labor Government for failing to build the Frankston By-pass concurrently with EastLink, causing significant problems for Frankston and the Frankston Central Business District and causing severe traffic congestion.
