

Sept. 1984, Queensland.

Chris & I were on holiday with
Annette, husband & family at Noosa.
Had dinner one night & all had had
some alcohol. We were discussing Stephen
& then Chris said "Get him out of
that school — it stinks". I
answered Chris that Steve was doing
well & leave him alone he (Chris) had
had his chance but chose not to
contribute was different & was
didn't work well. Chris then said he
him - I said "What is wrong with
Alan Swinley" Chris then answered "Oh
yes he was good, especially when
he had his in in my mouth"
& exploded & told Chris to go & was
his mouth out with soap — he
broke down & cried. He was 26
& I knew there was something
seriously wrong, but because of
shock & not knowing what to do
nothing else was said until he
came home & told & discussed it
with Peter. Peter then fished his diary
out, then he & Chris had
lunch one day & Peter got
Chris to give him the story in full.

Peter then made an appointment to see Bro. Hawe & so he passed on what Chris had told him. Bro. Hawe was very concerned, but asked if Chris could speak with him. Peter said Chris agreed he would never set foot on St. Jaey's Rail again, but he would ask him. Chris agreed to see Bro. Hawe that night & Chris spoke & Bro. Hawe took notes. By 9.30 - 10 AM the next morning Bro. Hawe rang Peter & told him he had been to Nell. to speak with Bro. Chappell & Bro. Ch. would like Peter to go up to Nell. & see Fred. Bro. Ch. said he would discuss the situation with their solicitor & be in touch. The following week Bro. Hawe rang for Peter to go up to see him & he told him (Peter) that their solicitor had warned about defamation of character suits, & also told us that if ~~the~~ allegations could be proven, that Swiniger would almost certainly face 5 yrs. jail. This was ~~the~~ end of September 1984. The next 2 months went by then it was the last week of Nov. & Peter & I decided it was up to us to do something, otherwise Swiniger would be teaching Steve the following year. Peter decided to take things into his

his own hands, so went & met Swingle after school one night & told him (Swingle) that he knew what he'd done to our son. Swingle answered that "he was sorry, it was a long time ago". Peter told him to shut up & that he wanted him out of the school by the following year, so as not to be teaching Steve.

Two days later Swingle hung around business & told him he orange hat to teach Stephen or he was pretty sure he could get an appointment somewhere else — Peter told him to accept the latter. The following week was the end of school year so as we had no Chappell I Peter decided to ring Bro. Hawe & tell him what had happened over the last few weeks. Bro. Hawe told Peter he was surprised when Swingle had resigned & that it had upset his curriculum for the following year!!

That didn't go down too well especially as by this time we had a very sick man on our hands. We did not know where Swingle was going, but didn't really care as long as he wasn't at St. Joe's. At this time I (Bew) was on St. Bernard Parish Council. At a previous meeting, I had confidentially told

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Mr. Fitzpatrick of our problems, but
~~he~~ he did not mention the name
of the perpetrator, only a couple
of boys names that Chris had
suggested he thought had also
been victims of Swinler. The week
before Christmas the group had
their break-up. During supper
Mr. Fitz. took me aside & asked me
how Chris was going etc. I told
him about Peter facing the teacher
& that the teacher had rung with
two opinions & now Peter told him
to move. Mr. Fitz. said to me its
yes & then Swinler is it? — I said
was going to St. Mary's. Chris was
really sick — ~~had~~ had a nervous
break down. The following May, was
suicidal & generally hard to handle
He had been to a ~~the~~ psychologist who
in turn had recommended him to
Darc House (psychiatric unit, Greetland
Hospital.) He saw Dr. Helen Newland
Psychiatrist, also Chris Mackay
Psychologist over a period of two
months, then wanting to go any more
then I persuaded him to go to Rape
Crisis Centre & he got on very well
there. We now ender 1986.
During 1985 I visited Bro. Hawe

3 times, pleading with him
 to do something about giving
 searching at St. Mary's. He was
 always very courteous & would
 say he'd let Bro. Chappell know
 that I had been to see him.
 Finally in ~~1986~~ April 1986. I could
 sense that Chris was not going
 to get better until something had
 been done. I (Bw) did some
 anonymous inquiries & finally spoke
 with Jim Massley from Community
 Policing. I went home & told Chris
 about this great bloke whom I am
 sure he would feel comfortable with.
 That afternoon Chris went with
 Jim Massley & revealed all. The
 next morning he went in again
 & made the statement — then Peter
 & I went in & put in our bid.
 This was mid April 1986. Still
 no word or follow up from Bro. Hawe
 or Chappell — not even a ~~curt~~
 word ~~for~~ as to the health of Chris.
 I was getting mad & so to show
 my anger I decided not to pay
 Stephen's fees until Bro. Hawe
 contacted me. This was not until
 the end of Nov. 1986. When I received
 a note asking me to "with respect"
 pay Stephen's fees for the year.
 With cheque book in hand I
 went to see him & told him how
 disillusioned I was with the fact

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of caring interest in the welfare
of our Son especially as to the
fact that he was so sick because
of what had happened to him
whilst a pupil at St. Joe's.
Bro. Hawe assured me that Chris
was always in their prayers,
however I told him that prayer
without "good works" meant
nothing to me. I paid the fees
as did that son. Bro. Hawe again
stated that the police had accepted
Chris' case & so we were now playing a
waiting game. Twice the case was
sent to court & then adjourned
the third time the case was
dropped. This was 12th Aug. 1987.
It was a terrible shock to all of
us, especially Chris. Two weeks later
Chris shot himself through the
upper left leg. as a sign of
frustration & frustration. & to draw
attention to his plight & fight
for justice.

In the beginning
Peter & I wanted immediate dismissal
of Swinbler but we did understand
later on that that was not possible
without a conviction or other "back up".
However once he was charged, he could
have been "stood down" until the outcome
was known, especially when the safety
of other boys was at risk.

Bro. Chappell told me that Swinbler had
transferred to St. Mary's without the
head (Bro. Mackay, I think) having been
notified of the allegations.
