I am a volunteer at Sassafras / Ferny Creek CFA.

I would like to take a few minutes of your time to present my views on the Fire Services Bill you are considering. Firstly, I would like to state that the combining of both the restructure and the presumptive rights together is nothing short of blackmail. It was combined to make you feel that you should pass this bill so as to seen doing the right thing by paid and volunteers alike. I have spoken to a few people who are affected by the presumptive right bill directly and they are of the opinion that they would be more than happy to wait longer rather than have this bill included in the splitting up of CFA. (in my opinion a very strong sentiment from people who are in the middle of battling a life threatening disease)

Secondly, I don't believe for one moment that there is a CFA volunteer who would say that the organisation could not use a little tweaking. Should this bill pass in it's current form, then over 90% of the surge capacity is gone from CFA. Not for a few weeks, months or even years but forever. This is not just a throwaway line, this is fact.

Should we have, (and I may hasten to add, I hope not) another Black Saturday of 2009 and the experts tell us, it's not a matter of if, but when, who is going to be there to fight these fires? I urge you to please consult with those who know, not those who say they know and are actually pushing the case for the unions and government. Ask the local captains, the people who have fought campaign fires across this and other states. Ask the local residents in high fire danger areas and most of all ask your inner self, if it's worth demolishing the house because the front door needs adjustment.
