

Fire Services Reform Select Committee 2017 Submission

Our Group wishes to make the following submission as to concerns with regards to the above;

- The Presumptive Rights Compensation Legislation Fire Services Amendment Reform should be two
 (2) separate pieces of legislation.
- 2. The rights of volunteers under the Presumptive Rights Compensation legislation should be the same as paid firefighters as we are exposed to the same risks and hazards.
- There has been no consultation with brigades as to the changes and the impact of new legislation both outlined in 1 above.
- 4. What will be the impact on 'Surge Capacity' when dealing with fires due to the splitting of fire services?
- 5. Goodwill is eroding and members are leaving due to uncertainties of what will be the final outcome.
- There is simply a black box approach to proposed changes no one knows what will happen or how things will be done.
- 7. What will be the impact on training of volunteers with fulltime staff going across to Fire Services Victoria as training is already an issue, and finally
- The total process fails to address 'The commitment' outlined in the last paragraph of the Volunteer Charter.
