Firey says reforms 'overdue'

Changes would modernise services

A DANDENONG firefighter says the planned restructure of paid and volunteer fire services is "long overdue".

Ryan Vague, who has worked at the Dandenong station for five years, is urging politicians to support the proposal that is before the state Upper House.

The move would see the creation of Fire Rescue Victoria for paid firefighters, while the CFA would be solely for volunteers.

Mr Vague, a United Firefighters Union member, said the changes would benefit brigades and make them more efficient, particularly in areas such as Greater Dandenong. The Dandenong CFA last year attended 2432 call-outs.

He said he wasn't detracting from the great work of volunteers, but wanted to highlight the need to adapt and modernise. "We've got to come up to speed with the growth that's occurred."

Greater Dandenong Council discussed the impact of reforms at last week's meeting as councillor Tim Dark called on the council to oppose splitting volunteer and integrated stations. Councillors did not support the motion, but agreed to seek further meetings with the government.

After the meeting, Cr Dark, a former volunteer fire-fighter, said that volunteers were "well and truly under threat by these proposed changes".

Mr Vague said even with new branding, volunteers and paid firefighters would continue to work together.

"Whatever change comes, it's still going to be business as usual whatever badge we carry—that's to provide a service to the community and that will continue no matter what." he said.

Mr Vague said the current model that relied on volunteers was no longer viable for Melbourne's expanding suburbs, urban growth corridors and regional centres.
