

## Establishment of the Community Crime Prevention Program

The government has a strong focus on local communities. Local communities and the local governments that represent them, have a clear and important role to play in crime prevention.

The Community Crime Prevention Program targets a range of initiatives at the local community level, to empower and support communities to take an active role in identifying and developing responses to local community issues.

### Community Safety Fund Grant (CSF)

- Grants up to \$10,000 for councils and community groups to implement practical community safety initiatives
  - \$1 million funding for 155 projects in 2011/12
  - \$3 million over the next three financial years


## Public Safety Infrastructure Fund Grants

- Grants of up to \$250,000 for local councils to develop public safety infrastructure
  - \$2.4 million funding for 24 projects in 2011/2012
  - \$8 million over the next three financial years

#### **Graffiti Prevention and Removal Grants**

- Grants of up to \$25,000 for councils to partner with communities to prevent and remove graffiti
  - 18 projects funded totalling \$300,000 in 2011/2012
  - \$900,000 over the next three financial years

Reducing Violence Against Women and their Children Grants

- \$7.2 million over three years (2012/13 2015/16) to help prevent violence against women and their children
  - \$4.8 million allocated to provide single grants of \$600,000 to each of the 8 DOJ regions
  - \$2.4 million dedicated to grants for Koori communities



Launch of the AFL DVD to prevent violence against women and launch of the Victoria's endorsement of the National Plan to reduce Violence against Women and their Children.





#### Graffiti Removal

- Removed 265,451sqms of graffiti
  - equal to 13.08 MCG playing fields
  - worth \$6.6m at commercial removal rates
  - offenders have undertaken 70,135 hours of unpaid community work.








#### Neighbourhood Watch

- To help reinvigorate NHW, \$550,000 allocated over four years for a state manager and accommodation for its state headquarters.
- NHW is also looking at innovative opportunities to reinvigorate such as the "EyeWatch" scheme with Victoria Police.





# Establishment of Regional Crime Prevention Reference Groups

- Provide a partnership forum to improve cooperation and collaboration across government, local government, police and community on crime prevention priorities.
- Play a vital role in developing locally based initiatives for community safety and crime prevention
