






Context – Economic Climate

- Global economic conditions are challenging
- Unemployment to peak in 2012-13 before reducing from 2013-14
- Tax revenue and GST grants downgraded












Context – Student Performance

Victorian students perform above the Australian average across

the majority of NAPLAN test areas.

However...

- Our performance has flat lined while other jurisdictions improve
- We are falling behind global competitors (PISA)



Need to **boost student performance** to move our education system from good to great and create a competitive advantage.



Within a challenging fiscal environment, our priorities are:

Protecting vulnerable children and growing their opportunities

Promoting improvement in student learning through targeted, coherent reform

Refocusing Victoria's Vocational Education and Training system

Building on \$973.8 million delivered in 2011-12, this Budget will

Increase school funding by three per cent in 2012-13

Provide \$36.4 million over four years for output initiatives

Provide \$200 million for asset initiatives

\$200m - Quality School Infrastructure

School Capital Election Commitments

\$86 million to deliver second tranche of school capital election commitments

Over half-way to completing infrastructure election commitments this term.

Projects include:



Ashwood SC Modernisation - \$10.5m



Bairnsdale SC Modernisation - \$10.0m



Phoenix P-12 Modernisation (Stage 1) - \$10.0m









\$200m - Quality School Infrastructure

New School and Land Acquisitions

- Doreen South PS \$10m
- Land acquisition in growth areas \$20.4m

High priority projects

- Galvin Park SC Modernisation \$14m
- Completion of the Boronia K-12 Regeneration \$15m

Major investment in Regional and Rural Victoria

- Over \$81 million across regional Victoria
- \$10 million for Wodonga Senior SC
- \$8.3 million for Northern Bay P-12
- \$20 million for election commitments at Bairnsdale SC and Phoenix P-12 (Ballarat)







Summary

The 2012-13 Budget brings the total investment in education over the Government's first two budgets to \$1.2 billion

- ✓ Completed output election commitments
- ✓ On track to complete capital commitments
