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My father passed away in April 2014 at the age of 86 of natural causes.

For the last 6 years of his life he had no quality of life due to the physical toll on his body from a hard manual working life and workplace injuries and the on set of dementia.

He lived the last years of his life in a high level care aged peoples home, as my mother was not able to care for him.
