Dear Ms Topic,

I wish to make a submission to the End-of-Life Parliamentary Enquiry.

The matters of prostitution and abortion are not pleasant to talk about but since these matters have been legalized with certain safeguards and controls, life in Victoria is a lot more civilized with less police corruption and "backyarders" performing a necessary service to the community. Now women can have abortions in safety!

I believe that someone with an incurable ailment and particularly in pain should be given the opportunity to die peacefully if that is their desire.
