Question

Mr Hibbins: Sorry, I am not sure if we covered this yesterday or today, but are you able to provide the Committee, and perhaps take it on notice, with the entire funding allocated for this site, the Port Phillip site? And I think you also provide funding to Western Port as well?

Response

Melbourne Water is the Site Coordinator for Edithvale Seaford Wetlands, and site Manager for the WTP portion of the Port Phillip Bay and Bellarine Peninsula site (the site coordinator for this site is the Corangamite CMA).

With this in mind, Melbourne Water is able to provide a level of detail around our funding of those two sites. Questions regarding the full funding for the Port Phillip Ramsar site are best addressed by the site Coordinator.

Melbourne Water does not have any formal Ramsar management responsibilities at the Westernport Ramsar site (aside from having representation at the site coordinating committee meetings).

Costing categories

For the two sites where we maintain formal Ramsar responsibilities, our costings are represented across the following categories.

1. Investigations

Investigations include conservation management plan development, environmental flows investigations and reporting to the Federal Government.

2. Monitoring

Monitoring of key values on site such as waterbirds, Growling Grass Frogs, vegetation quality.

3. Maintenance

The main maintenance expense is weed control (chemical spraying, brush cutting, hand weeding), followed by pest animal control (fox, cats & rabbits) and maintenance of civil assets such as fences and flow control structures.

4. Capital Works

Construction of civil assets such as fences and flow control structure.
