- Conducted Victoria's largest community engagement process as part of developing the Metropolitan Planning Strategy
- ✓ Released Geelong (G21) Regional Growth Plan
- ✓ Developed seven draft Regional Growth Plans currently undergoing consultation
- ✓ Adjusted the Urban Growth Boundary

- Rezoned 240 hectares at Fishermans Bend
- ✓ Released the Ferry Services Discussion paper linking the city and the west
- ✓ Introduced Design Review Panel to improve the design quality of government projects
- ✓ Protected Yarra and Maribyrnong Rivers

- √ \$6.5 billion worth of development in the CBD, Docklands, Southbank, Dandenong and Footscray
- ✓ Procurement guidelines 'Government as Smart Client'
- ✓ Over \$438 million worth of works to the 2,300 places on the Victorian Heritage Register
- ✓ Housing Melbourne Symposium

Key Achievements 2012-13 Efficient Land Management - Land Victoria

✓ Completed the 2012 biennial revaluation

✓ Legislation to enable Victoria to be the first to join the National Electronic Conveyancing System

✓ Conducted 650,000 property transactions worth \$70 billion
