Budget overview

\$224 million over four years

Investment focusing on:

- Delivering essential supports
- Ensuring services are sustainable
- SACS
- Closing Sandhurst
- Launching the NDIS in Barwon

Delivering essential supports

- \$107 million for 720 new ISPs for people with high support needs.
- Continue funding for the Transitions to Employment lapsing program to meet demand from 200 students with a disability currently in the school system and needing vocational support.
- \$4 million will provide approximately 1,440 more people access to aids and equipment.

Sustainable services

More than \$62 million additional in this Budget to help meet the increasingly complex needs of people with disability living in Government-run supported accommodation.

Introduce a standard board and lodging fee for DHS-managed disability accommodation to provide consistency, fairness and transparency. Used to fund additional ISPs to people on the Disability Support Register.

More than \$26 million for a wage rise in 2013-14 for about 13,000 disability workers as a result of a Fair Work Australia decision (the SACS Award).

Closure of Sandhurst Residential Services at Bendigo

- \$7.9 million to build new accommodation
- Up to five new supported accommodation homes, located in residential neighbourhoods
- Giving residents the opportunity to live with more choice and independence in their community

Launching the NDIS

- Signed agreement with the Commonwealth for the full roll out of the NDIS on 4 May 2013.
- \$17 million to support the Victorian launch of the NDIS in the Barwon region on 1 July 2013, taking the Victorian Government's total three-year investment in the launch site to more than \$300 million.
- Full rollout of the NDIS starting July 2016 and complete by June 2019.

What has been delivered: Disability services

Invested an additional \$366 million in disability services since coming into office.

- More Individual Support Packages: We are delivering over 1,500 additional Individual Support Packages for people with high support needs.
- Addressing the demand for accommodation by delivering 343 new accommodation and respite places for people with a disability.
- More funding for Aids and Equipment providing for an additional 4,800 people and top-up funding for around 400 children.
- Planning for the future by launching the NDIS in Barwon from 1 July, and rolling out the full scheme from 2016.
- Innovating and refining service delivery with Services Connect, our model for transforming human services to create a sustainable, integrated service delivery system.
