

2023-24 Budget – Key Initiatives

The Victorian Government is supporting manufacturing across the state and attracting investments to create new jobs

\$37.50 million to support Victorian manufacturers to create more high-value jobs in Victoria, including:

- **\$21.20 million** for Made in Victoria – supporting the growth of Victoria’s manufacturing sector, to establish the Manufacturing and Industry Sovereignty Fund
- **\$12.30 million** for delivering Victoria’s mRNA industry, to support the development of major sovereign mRNA facilities and supporting ecosystem
- **\$4.00 million** for Made in Victoria – supporting Victoria’s defence manufacturing industry, to support Victoria’s defence and space industry and supply chains
