Question Asked:

Richard WELCH: I am just conscious of time, Chair. Maybe you can just take it on notice, but I would be interested to know how, as a peak body, you would be able to make it more efficient for the industry – just your contributions on that.

Anthony CAMM: We probably would take that on notice and we would certainly look at that.

Response:

Insurance: Adopting a model like Regional Arts Victoria (RAV) for the small, community-run sector could be an option for insurance coverage. There service provides its members with cost effective insurance. This is achieved by RAV purchasing a policy that allows the inclusion of additional beneficiaries, whether individuals and organisational members. Individual members, who are creative sector practitioners, can procure combined liability insurance at a cost of \$200 in addition to the \$60 annual membership fee. For-profit small creative organisations can apply for performance accident insurance for volunteer worker and combined liability insurances. Not-for-profit small creative organisations (e.g. festivals, galleries, local arts councils) can receive association liability, insurance volunteer worker and combined liability insurances.
