



#### **REGIONAL JOBS GROWTH, 2016**







#### **OPERATING SURPLUS**





# **AVERAGE REVENUE GROWTH\***




# **OUR REVENUE BASE**

#### **TAXATION AND ROYALTY REVENUE PER CAPITA**




# LOWEST PAYROLL TAX RATE IN AUSTRALIA FOR REGIONAL VICTORIA

## HISTORIC ACTION ON FAMILY VIOLENCE

## Helping victims of family violence when they need it most

A further \$1.9 billion to build a future where Victorians are free from family violence

- > **\$448.1 million** to establish 17 Support and Safety Hubs
- > \$270.8 million for victim survivor assistance
- > **\$269.4 million** to enhance the response of Victoria's legal system, including specialist Family Violence Courts in several locations across the State
- > \$133.2 million for safe family violence refuges, additional public housing and private rental accommodation
- > \$95.4 million to strengthen our family violence workforce
- > \$76.9 million to hold perpetrators to account and change behaviours
- > \$33.5 million to provide greater support for Aboriginal Victorians and Aboriginal organisations and communities

# **SAFER COMMUNITIES**

# A record \$2.0 billion boost to Victoria Police to reduce harm and put victims first

- > 2 700 new sworn police officers, including 415 specialist family violence officers
- > Youth Crime Prevention grants and an expansion of the Victoria Police Kokoda youth engagement program
- > 100 new Protective Services Officers
- > 10 upgraded police stations across the State

Over \$600 million to help ensure serious crimes are punished and perpetrators are held to account



## **PUBLIC TRANSPORT AND ROADS**

The Budget builds on major investments this Government has already made in transport infrastructure to get people home safer and sooner

#### **Public transport:**

- > **\$1.1 billion** for regional public transport including more Vlocity carriages and more punctual services
- > **\$879.5 million** for metropolitan public transport including more E-Class trams and a continued investment in the Night Network

#### Roads:

- > \$700 million towards upgrades for the M80 Ring Road, reducing congestion for the 160 000 drivers who use the freeway every day
- > \$530.6 million to improve roads in regional Victoria
- > \$300 million to build the Mordialloc Bypass
- > \$100 million for the North East Link for planning and pre-construction



# **EDUCATION FOR ALL**

\$1.3 billion to make sure we have the best teachers in our classrooms, the best facilities in our schools and that every child gets the support they need

- > A further \$685 million on new and upgraded schools
- > \$87.1 million to help prepare our youngest Victorians for school
- > \$84.3 million for IT upgrades across our schools
- > \$81.1 million for extra maternal and child health services
- > \$58.4 million to support additional students with disabilities attend school
- > \$50.7 million to help teachers and principals in 346 struggling schools
- > \$19.5 million for newly arrived students in government schools



## **HEALTH CARE WHEN YOU NEED IT**


## **Building on record-breaking investments in Victoria's health system**

\$2.9 billion so Victorians receive first-class health care, wherever they live

- > **\$1.3 billion** in hospital services to meet 41 000 more admissions and 38 000 more emergency treatments
- > \$428.5 million in hospital infrastructure to meet Victoria's growing heath care needs
- > \$319.9 million to reduce waiting time for elective surgery procedures
- > **\$215 million** to put patient safety first
- > \$69.2 million in health prevention and innovation to get the right care sooner
- > \$26.5 million to help our ambulance services to respond to every emergency sooner

\$406.7 million to boost mental health services and meet our most urgent needs
