Health overview

The 2017-18 Budget is investing **\$2 billion in health services, programs and agencies** – across metropolitan Melbourne and rural communities, including:


- **\$1.67 billion** to deliver more care to Victorian patients
- \$64 million to provide better care for Victorians
- **\$280 million** to offer **safer care** for Victorian patients and safer workplaces for our health workers

To support this investment, the Andrews Labor Government is funding capital projects worth **\$428.5 million** across Victoria


 This investment will support the implementation of Health 2040: advancing health, access and care - which presents a clear vision for the health and wellbeing of Victorians and for the Victorian healthcare system.

Acute Health Budget Output Growth

In 2017-18, \$13.13 billion will be invested in acute health services – an increase of 10.5% on 2016-17.



More care for Victorian patients




- \$14.1 million cancer screening package will deliver 45,000 more breast, bowel and oral cancer screens
- \$2 million to support more rural and regional Victorians' access to health services through the Victorian Patient Transport Assistance Program
 - **\$1.2 million** to expand the hepatitis B vaccination program, delivering 10,000 more vaccinations

Better care for Victorians

- \$34.2 million to deliver the biggest boost to the Operational Infrastructure Support Program in its history, backing Victoria's world-leading medical researchers, scientists and institutions to develop treatments and find cures
- \$11.6 million to partner with the Commonwealth to improve care for patients with multiple, complex and chronic conditions
- \$10 million for another round of Better Care Victoria's Innovation Fund, delivering more and improved hospital and health services right across the state
- \$8.4 million to provide more Victorians with rare diseases access to genomic sequencing to get diagnoses and treatments sooner



Safer care for Victorian patients and safer workplaces for our health workers





- **\$38.4 million** for health workers to be trained in how to identify the signs of family violence and support people experiencing harm to get the help they need
- \$15.6 million to better prepare for thunderstorm asthma
- \$7.9 million to give the Health Complaints Commissioner greater capacity to crack down on rogue and dodgy practitioners
- \$3 million to address violence against health care workers and workplace bullying

Building Better Hospitals - \$428.5 million in new hospital upgrades and equipment

- \$162.7 million expansion of the Northern Hospital
- *\$50 million* to begin work on a new Footscray Hospital
- \$63.2 million expansion of the Monash Medical Centre emergency department and improved access for ambulances
- \$40 million Royal Melbourne Hospital key infrastructure upgrade
- **\$29.8 million** Austin Health critical infrastructure works
- \$60 million for new medical equipment and upgrade infrastructure across the state
- *\$11.9 million* for cybersecurity controls and tools
- *\$7.5 million* Warrnambool Hospital planning and design works
- \$2.2 million boost to open 11 new intensive care and neonatal intensive care beds in health services across Victoria.

Rural and Regional Health and Ambulance Capital Projects
