Youth Affairs portfolio


Strengthening our engagement with young people and investing in initiatives that support and empower young people is a priority for the Andrews Labor Government.

Youth Affairs investment




- 2017-18 investment of \$19.3m in youth affairs output

2017-18 Victorian Budget – Improving outcomes for young people

This budget provides \$5.8 million over four years to strengthen the engagement and empowerment of young people in Aboriginal communities, from multicultural backgrounds and in rural and regional Victoria.

- > **\$2 million** over two years for youth advocacy, programs and referrals in Swan Hill, Warrnambool, Morwell and Ballarat.
- > **\$1.8 million** over two years to continue and expand the Aboriginal Youth Mentoring program.
- > **\$2 million** over four years to support the social participation of young people through Scouts Victoria and Girl Guides Victoria.
