

Victorian Budget 2017/18



Mental Health and Alcohol and Other Drugs services investment growth

The 2017/18 budget invests **14 per cent** more for mental health and alcohol and other drug services than the investment in 2016-17. Over the last three budgets that is an increase of **166.7 per cent** compared to the previous three years



2017/18 Budget overview

Investing \$406.7 million to make access to support quicker and easier.



- \$201.1 million to meet clinical services demand and provide additional inpatient services
- \$39.4 million to enhance the mental health system
- \$85.2 million to boost forensic mental health services
- \$81.1 million invested in the Stage 3 Ice Action Plan

Meeting clinical services demand

The Government is investing **\$201.1 million** to meet clinical services demand and provide additional inpatient services, as well as a further **\$39.4 million** to enhance the mental health system:

- **\$9.1 million** to employ more allied health staff for weekend inpatient unit coverage
- \$8.4 million to make sure Aboriginal Victorians in need receive appropriate mental health support
- \$3.5 million to support the operation of the Mental Health Tribunal
- \$10.0 million for Facilities Renewal Grants
- \$8.3 million to build a Grampians Prevention and Recovery Care centre





Boosting forensic mental health services to keep us safe

The Government is investing **\$85.2 million** to boost forensic mental health services:

- \$41.3 million to implement priority service reforms, including:
 - Community Mental Health programs to provide assessment and treatment for offenders on a Community Corrections Order
 - establishment of a Mental Health Advice and Response Service
 - enhanced clinical in-reach of mental health assessment, treatment and support services for young offenders in the justice system
 - establishment of a Forensic Youth Mental Health Service
- \$3.9 million to expand the secure Forensic Mental Health Unit for Youth Justice clients
- \$40 million to expand Thomas Embling Hospital and adult forensic mental health capacity

Taking action on ice and other drugs

The Government is investing **\$81.1 million** in Stage Three of the Ice Action Plan, including:



- \$34.8 million for 30 new rehabilitation beds, drug treatment services for 3800 Victorian parents, and 960 treatment places for people on community correction orders
- \$12.4 million to expand services for those transitioning in or out of alcohol or drug treatment, who may be at risk of overdose
- \$14.1 million to employ 34 Aboriginal health workers to address drug use in Aboriginal communities
- \$4.1 million to strengthen alcohol and other drug treatment data systems
- \$6.0 million to provide increased phone and web-based support for those unable to access face-to-face services
- \$9.7 million to acquire land in the Gippsland, Hume and Barwon regions to build new residential drug rehabilitation facilities
