#### Focused on what matters most

# Our economy is strong and growing, but cost of living pressures are still hurting Victorian families

As a government, we're on their side. This is a budget that is focused on what matters most. We are:

- → Delivering new and expanded cost of → living help for working people and their families
- → Investing more in the frontline services we know matter most to Victorian families

We can deliver these investments because of our responsible approach to financial management. We are:

- Delivering an operating surplus in the budget year
- Commissioning an independent review of Victoria's Public Service
- Delivering on Victoria's Economic Growth Statement
- Backing Victorian businesses and Victorian jobs
- Moderating infrastructure investment over the forward years



### Help with the cost of living

This Budget delivers \$2.3 billion in cost-of-living help – the biggest investment of its kind in Victoria's history

**\$156 million** in cost-of-living help to save money at home, including:

- → A new \$100 Power Saving Bonus for eligible Victorian households with a concession card
- → 27,000 more rebates for electric heat pumps and solar hot water systems

**\$320 million** to save on transport costs, including:

- Free public transport for kids and teens under 18
- → Free statewide public transport for seniors on weekends

**\$529 million** to make care more affordable and accessible, incl. through:

 Saving money on GP appointments by enabling pharmacists to provide medications that would usually require a doctor's script

**\$1.3 billion** to help families with kids at school or kinder, and students at TAFE:

- Free Kinder, saving families up to \$2,600 per child, per year
- → More than 65,000 extra Get Active Kids vouchers



#### A growing economy


Victoria's economy is growing – and is being propelled by strong jobs growth and record business investment

- → The Victorian economy is estimated → to be almost 14 per cent larger in real terms in 2024-25 than it was in 2018-19 before the COVID-19 pandemic
- → Since the peak impacts of the pandemic in 2020, Victorian business investment has increased by 46 per cent, compared with 28 per cent in the rest of the country
- Over the past year alone, investment grew by 3.7 per cent, compared to a 1.3 per cent fall across the rest of Australia

#### Delivering our world-class transport network

By investing in public transport and roads, we're connecting Victorians – to work, school and each other

- → \$4.1 billion to build a superhub at Sunshine Station, taking a crucial first step towards Airport Rail, in partnership with the Commonwealth
- → \$727 million to switch on the Metro Tunnel, delivering more trains more often on the Sunbury, Cranbourne, and Pakenham lines
- → \$976 million in 2025-26 alone to deliver a Better Road Blitz – fixing potholes and resurfacing roads across our state
- \$46 million to deliver more services on the Craigieburn, Sandringham, Upfield and Werribee lines



#### More funding for frontline care

## Investing in our hospitals means peace of mind for Victorian families

- → \$9.3 billion for hospital care, including → opening and operationalising nine new or expanded hospitals, including the new Footscray, redeveloped Frankston and Maryborough and District Hospitals
- → \$497 million to support Victoria's mental health and wellbeing system, including \$319 million to support and improve mental health infrastructure
- **\$437 million** to expand the Victorian Virtual Emergency Department – and make it permanent – supporting three times as many Victorians to access free, 24/7 urgent care
- \$230 million to boost performance in emergency departments and ambulance response times



#### Investing in our kids and their classrooms

Every family wants their kids to have the best start in life – and that begins with a great education

- \$1.5 billion to deliver new schools, school upgrades and maintenance, because every family deserves a great local school
- → \$133 million to drive excellence in reading, writing and maths at every level, because we want every Victorian child to reach their full potential
- \$320 million to complete the statewide rollout of the Disability Inclusion reform in schools, because children with disability deserve the same opportunities as every other young Victorian
- \$159 million to attract, retain and support teachers, because great classrooms depend on great teachers



#### More homes for a growing Victoria

Unlocking planning, reducing the cost of purchasing, and building new homes faster

- → Unlocking planning for another 50 activity centres around train and tram stops that will help an extra 300,000 homes be delivered in metropolitan Melbourne by 2051
- \$61 million to extend the stamp duty concession announced in October 2024, slashing stamp duty on eligible off-the-plan apartments, units and townhouses
- → \$249 million to enable infrastructure works – such as roads, sewerage and water – that increase housing supply across the state, in partnership with the Commonwealth
  - \$61 million to continue funding to help people experiencing homelessness find a permanent place to live



#### Keeping communities safe

We've introduced tough new laws – to hold offenders to account, and keep communities safe

- \$1.6 billion to back in Victoria's new bail laws, with funding to support our police and justice workforces, speed up our courts, deliver Australia's first machete ban and keep communities safe
- → \$727 million to ramp up capacity in Victoria's prisons and youth justice centres, including bringing almost 1,000 additional adult beds online, and 88 youth justice beds
- → \$206 million to ensure we continue to keep communities safe, supporting the operational capacity and firefighting capability of the state's emergency service organisations
- → \$176 million to break the cycle of reoffending and stop crime before it begins



#### A strong regional Victoria

Wherever you live, every Victorian deserves to be connected, supported and cared for

- \$777 million for regional roads and transport, connecting people to jobs, services and opportunities
- → \$216 million for regional healthcare, including \$84 million for regional and rural ambulances
- \$117 million to improve regional education facilities and services
- \$50 million regional stream in the new Victorian Investment Fund, dedicated to supporting fast growing businesses to enhance economic development, generating capital investment and new jobs in regional cities and towns



#### **Self-determination for First Peoples**

Continuing Victoria's commitment to self-determination, including through Truth and Treaty

A further **\$167 million** will support selfdetermined and culturally responsive services, including:

- → \$25 million to empower ACCOs to support and advocate for First Nations children and young people in the child protection and family services system
- \$18 million to pilot Aboriginal Community Controlled vocational education and training models, and grow the First Nations VET workforce

We're also investing **\$24 million** to improve economic participation and prosperity for First Peoples, including:

- → \$5.6 million to support First Nations businesses to compete locally and globally, and funding to host the World Indigenous Business Forum
- → \$4.9 million to create a First Peoples Leadership Academy, which will grow emerging leaders across business, government and communities
