2025 Western Victoria Bushfires recovery

The 2025-26 Budget provides \$77.5m to address recovery needs from the Western Victoria Bushfires.



Supporting businesses in 2024-25

- \$5,000 grants for small businesses and eligible primary producers
- Business Recovery Advisory service providing free business support
- Tourism and marketing activities to boost visitors to the Grampians region



Supporting environment, land and biodiversity recovery in 2024-25

- Support for survival of key native species
- Repairs to strategic road networks and signage replacement
- Treatment of hazardous trees
- Gate Fee Rebate program for impacted LGAs

Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements – Support for councils



How we're helping councils with their DRFA claims:

- Additional claims assessors
- Expert DRFA contractors
- DRFA experts working directly with priority councils
- Provision of training to councils

Councils and DRFA – high-level process

Natural disaster occurs and causes damage that meets DRFA threshold

Councils notify Emergency Recovery Victoria of intention to claim under DRFA

Councils undertake relief and recovery activities in response to emergency

Victorian government assesses claims in line with DRFA guidelines

Approved claims are paid out to councils

Continued recovery support for past events



October 2022 Victorian floods

- **4,400** households accessed the Flood Recovery Support Program
- Housed **2,212** flood-affected people in temporary accommodation
- 63 Local Government Areas affected





OFFICIAL Continued recovery support for past events



December 2023 – January 2024 Victorian storms and floods

- More than **545** households have accessed the Recovery Support Program
- **Re-impacted** areas that were affected during October 2022 floods
- 29 Local Government Areas affected

Continued recovery support for past events



February 2024 Victorian storms and bushfires

- **4,500** impacted households accessed the Recovery Support Program
- Clean-up supported **187** properties for hazardous tree remediation and **21** structural demolitions
- 38 Local Government Areas affected
