



Investing in school education



An additional **\$2.9 billion,** including **\$1.5 billion** in infrastructure, brings the total government investment to **\$38.6 billion since 2015–16,** including \$18.5 billion to build and upgrade schools in every corner of the state.

In 2024, Victorian students performed above the national average in all domains across years 3, 5, 7 and 9. Victoria ranked first for Reading and Numeracy in Year 3. Victoria ranked first for Writing in years 5, 7 and 9. More than 70% of Year 3 and more than 75% of Year 5 students achieved in the 'strong' or 'exceeding' proficiency levels for Reading.




