










Importance of early years services












Increase in demand – birth notifications



Percentage change in MCH birth notifications between 2000/01 and 2009/10










Increase in demand – early childhood services

National context

National Partnership on Early Childhood Education

 Provide every child with access to a preschool program for 15 hours a week in the year before school by 2013.

National Partnership on Indigenous Early Childhood Development

 Delivery of two Children and Family Centres in Victoria in Bairnsdale and Whittlesea.

National Partnership on the National Quality Agenda for Early Childhood Education and Care

 Creation of a national quality framework from 1 January 2012 to replace State regulation and Commonwealth accreditation of children's services.


