

Supporting regional tertiary education

\$20 million Regional Partnership Facilitation Fund (RPFF)

Established through the Government's \$1 billion *Regional Growth Fund*

RPFF will drive partnerships between universities, TAFEs and other registered training organisations

Deliver more opportunities for regional Victorians to undertake higher education closer to home

RPFFsupported partnerships will: Grow the **breadth and depth** of higher education programs delivered in Victoria

Maximise the relevance of tertiary education programs to regional Victoria by **facilitating collaboration** between tertiary education institutions, local industry, schools and communities
