•1800 major upgrades.


•1600 new properties will be built this year

Housing – A Pathway not a Destination

- Three quarters of public housing households receive no income from work
- •Less than 10% homelessness clients work either full time or part time
- •Recognise the multiple barriers faced by many Victorians
- •Committed to breaking the cycle
- •Creating pathways and opportunities for people to reach their potential
