
A focus on road renewal

- Delivery of the 2024-25 road maintenance program is continuing, backed by a \$964 million investment
- Investment focus has *shifted* from patching to longer-term outcomes.
- \$976 million invested in maintaining Victoria's road assets in *Victorian Budget 2025/26*



VicRoads Joint Venture

The VicRoads Joint Venture is delivering modern and improved services, with new products including:

- Victoria's digital driver license;
- Vehicle history reports;
- Additional account security; and
- Uplifts in customer service



Delivering Road Safety Action Plan 2

\$412 million to implement the second action plan in the 10-year road safety strategy including:

- installing road safety barriers
- upgrading safety at priority rural intersections
- extending and expanding mobile-phone and seat-belt detection cameras



Safe Local Roads and Streets Program

The Victorian Government is working with each local government across the state to deliver the \$210 million Safe Local Roads and Streets Program.

The first project was completed in Clifton Springs near Geelong in September, where a roundabout and raised pedestrian crossings were constructed to improve pedestrian safety.
