


78 concrete actions across government

Building on our achievements

- Continues to strengthen our response to young people
- Brings to near completion the statewide consolidation of mental health triage
- Introduces priority areas for early implementation

Mental Health Challenges for 2010-11

- Prevention and early intervention capacity for children and young people
- Access to mental health triage
- Better treatment and care for older people
- Physical health of people with severe mental illness
- Recovery and active participation in our community
- Capacity of early childhood and school workforces to respond to mental health issues
- Implementation of the new Mental Health Act

Responding to the challenge: mental health reform strategy

\$174.9 million over four years:

- Early intervention for rural young people
- Youth suicide prevention
- Youth crisis response
- Pathways to care
- Better access for older people
- Building the capacity of early childhood and schools workforces
- Implementing the new Mental Health Act

Increased capacity

New Mental Health wing for Bendigo Hospital
\$56m TEI for a brand new inpatient facility
75 mental health beds (up from 42)

- New capital investment at Heidelberg
- \$14m TEI for a 22 bed Community Care Unit
- PARCs and acute beds

- \$46m over four years to operationalise newly completed beds by March 2011

- Bendigo 10 youth PARC beds
- Frankston 10 youth PARC beds
- Geelong 8 acute beds
- Northern 25 acute beds

Alcohol and Other Drugs achievements


- A stronger prevention and early intervention capacity
- Responding to increasing pressure on the AOD treatment sector due to population growth
- Better meeting individuals' complex needs, including needs of Indigenous Victorians
- Long term view to change drinking culture



Responding to the challenge: Alcohol and Other Drugs

\$20.8 million over four years:

- additional services in Melbourne's growth areas
- nursing support in Aboriginal AOD addiction services
- continuation of existing drug treatment and harm reduction services in St Kilda.





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
