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State of the Portfolio Sport

Sport is fundamental to Victorians and generates significant benefits to our state's economy.

- The sport and active recreation sector provides at least
 \$9.2 billion in Gross Value Add to Victoria's economy annually.
- Over 71,000 full time equivalent jobs are supported through the sport and active recreation sector.
- Victoria is home to 52 professional sports teams and
 32 national sports organisations.



State of the Portfolio Tourism and Major Events

Victoria is the tourism and major events capital of Australia and continues to deliver economic growth to our state.

- Victoria's tourism sector reached a new high of \$40 billion in total visitor expenditure in the year ending December 2024.
- International visitors continue to rebuild at 86% of 2019 levels.
- Tourism jobs in Victoria were up 8% year on year to
 288,800 jobs in 2023-24, outpacing overall jobs growth in Victoria over the same period (+3%).
- Victoria's major events calendar is valued at \$3.3 billion per annum.

Our Achievements - Sport

Continued support for our Victorian athletes, sporting events and world-class infrastructure.

Celebrated the success of the 122 Victorian Institute of Sport athletes at the 2024 Summer Olympics and Paralympics in Paris who returned with 23 medals – including 5 gold.

Supported 91 Significant Sporting Events in 2024-25, including the 2025 Maurie Plant Meet which attracted a sell out crowd of almost 10,000 attendees.

Commenced construction of the Ballarat Major Events Precinct upgrade which will include 5,000 new permanent seats at Mars Stadium, raising the seated capacity to 10,000.



Our Achievements – Major Events

Continued to support a world class events calendar

Melbourne is the only city in the world hosting a Grand Prix and Grand Slam.

A record 465,498 visitors attended the Formula 1 Australian Grand Prix, beating the previous record set at last year's race by over 13,000 visitors.

→ The 2025 Australian Open will officially go down as the biggest ever drawing a record crowd of more than 1.2 million total tennis fans.

Melbourne has the most interstate overnight visitors of all Australian cities – our strong events calendar helping to attract 6.0 million in 2024.

23 major events (Major Events Fund), 55 regional events (Regional Events Fund) and 28 business events (Business Events Fund) are expected to be held in 2024-25.



Our Achievements – Tourism

Tourism is delivering important initiatives through the Experience Victoria 2033 Strategy and supporting Victorian communities.

→ A further record high of \$645 million in international overnight spend in regional Victoria was achieved in 2024.

We supported 12 Visitor Economy Partnerships and Regional Tourism Boards to deliver industry strengthening activities.

Supported 203 infrastructure projects across rural and regional Victoria through tourism infrastructure programs.

→ Launched the \$8 million Enabling Tourism Fund 2024 and the \$62 million Regional Tourism Investment Fund 2024 to support the development of tourism infrastructure in regional Victoria and the \$3.6 million First Peoples Tourism Industry Strengthening Program.





Budget Initiatives Tourism, Sport and Major Events

- \$11 million over 3 years for the Victorian Convention and Event Trust to open and operate the Nyaal Banyul Geelong Convention and Event Centre.
- \$11 million over 2 years for Visitor Economy Partnerships operations to support the growth of regional visitor economies.
- **\$7.5 million** over 2 years for the Melbourne Convention Bureau, Business Events Victoria, and the Business Events Fund to attract and deliver business events.
- \$1.2 million over 2025-26 to support the Professional Boxing and Combat Sports Board deliver legislated regulatory requirements and a full review of the Professional Boxing and Combat Sports Act 1985.
