DH, AV and health services continue to work in partnership to improve patient flow in hospitals. This is crucial to get paramedics back on the road as quickly as possible.

Timely emergency care



The **Timely Emergency Care** program creates more capacity in our hospitals to improve the performance of EDs.

- reduce unnecessary admissions to hospital
- get patients who are admitted home sooner

Alternative care pathways



AV's **Secondary Triage Service** is preventing more than 14,000 unnecessary ambulance dispatches per month.

Department has seen over
500,000 patients and is
expanding with \$436 million
over four years for growth.

Workforce development

State Budget investments are supporting AV's workforce development initiatives:


- \$10 million to establish Australia's first Centre of Excellence for Paramedicine, in partnership with Victoria University
- \$20.1 million to establish new Paramedic Practitioner roles
- \$15.8 million to train an additional 40 MICA
 paramedics to respond to the highest priority patients
 in the community
- \$84.2 million for rural ambulance services to maintain 106 paramedic FTE and ambulance resources at 23 locations across rural and regional Victoria.



Finances

AV has been working closely with the Department of Health to support the organisation's finances.

This work is helping to ensure AV can meet its agreed Statement of Priorities operating result and provide a sustainable base going into 2025-26.
