# **TURKIYE AND GALLIPOLI ANZAC DELEGATION 2024**

# **Purpose**

The purpose of this Parliamentary trip to Türkiye was to:

- Represent my local communities at ANZAC commemoration services.
- Experience the harsh landscape of the Gallipoli peninsula to gain a better understanding of the Gallipoli landings and subsequent battles of the Gallipoli campaign.
- Pay my respects to the fallen soldiers from the Lowan electorate laid to rest in Gallipoli war cemeteries.
- Foster the strong Türkiye-Australian relationship and identify opportunities for future growth and development of trade and business growth of mutual benefit.

Türkiye and Australia share a unique bond, which originated in the shared experience of the horrors of war on the battlefields of Çanakkale (Gallipoli).

This year marks the 109<sup>th</sup> anniversary since the Gallipoli campaign that forged the spirit of the Anzacs of mateship, camaraderie, and mutual respect.

Values that now form part of the national identity for Australia, New Zealand and Türkiye.

I am a firm believer that we must honour the service and sacrifice of Australians that have represented our country and fought for the rights, freedoms, democracy and peaceful lifestyle that we enjoy in Australia today.

As a community leader, I am proud to have paid my respects at all known war graves of soldiers from the Lowan electorate that were accessible.

I thank the Hon. Tim Bull MP for his effort to identify all known soldiers from the Lowan electorate, and the RSLs across the Lowan electorate who provided poppies, provided additional information about soldiers from the local area that were involved in Gallipoli campaign. I would also like to acknowledge RSLs and communities across the Lowan electorate the continue the tradition of ANZAC

Day commemorative services to ensure that not only we remember them, but to ensure that we will never forget.

# Gallipoli

At Çanakkale, the Delegation attended the Ceremony for the 109th Anniversary of the Land Wars of Çanakkale, where the President of the Gallipoli Historic Site, Ismail Kasdemir, delivered a moving speech.

Mr Kasdemir particularly spoke about the common ground that Gallipoli now represents as a sacred meeting place to reflect and commemorate.

In addition to the Turkish commemoration, the Delegation also attended the ANZAC Day Gallipoli Dawn Service at ANZAC Cove, the Lone Pine Australian Service at Lone Pine Cemetery, and the New Zealand National Service at Chunuk Bair.

Other highlights of the trip were undoubtedly walking the sacred ground of the battle sites, in particular the cemeteries which in many cases, are located on battle grounds (e.g. Lone Pine and The Nek).

We were also in possession of Lone Pine seeks that were the descendants of the original Lone Pine.

These were provided by the Friends of Gallipoli and, to the best of anyone's knowledge, are the first descendent seeds to come back to Gallipoli from Australia.

We presented these seeds to the Mayor of Gallipoli, and our guide and caretaker of Australian war cemeteries in Turkiye, who escorted us around the battlegrounds and graves.

# **Official Meetings**

The Delegation visited the major cultural and historical sites of Istanbul which included the Dolmabahçe Palace, Sultan Ahmet Mosque, Ayasofya Mosque,

Basilicia Cistern, Topkapı Palace and the Bospohorus, as well as the historical ruins of Troya - places of immense historical and cultural significance for Türkiye.

We met with the chair of the Council of Foreign Economic Relations of the Türkiye-Australia Business Council. Mr Steven Young is an Australian of Turkish heritage based in Istanbul.

We spoke about growing business ties between Australia and Turkiye. He noted the opportunities that direct flights between Melbourne and Istanbul presented for business, trade and tourism. It was of particular interest to learn more about the large agricultural sector and opportuites for growth and development of international trade.

In Ankara, the Delegation had the honour of visiting the Mausoleum of Atatürk (Anıtkabir) to pay our respects, lay a wreath, and sign the Book of Honour. It serves as the resting place of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk.

Mustafa Kemal Atatürk led the Turkish forces at Gallipoli was the founder of the Republic of Türkiye, serving as its first President from 1923 until his death in 1938.

After the Gallipoli campaign, Atatürk famously said:

Those heroes that shed their blood and lost their lives...

You are now lying in the soil of a friendly country.

Therefore rest in peace.

There is no difference between the Johnnies and the Mehmets to us where they lie side by side now here in this country of ours...

You, the mothers, who sent their sons from faraway countries wipe away your tears;

Your sons are now lying in our bosom and are in peace.

After having lost their lives on this land they have become our sons as well.

Anakara also afforded the opportunity to join the Australian Ambassador, Mr Miles Armitage, from the Embassy of Australia in Ankara, and Parliamentarians of the Türkiye Australia friends group from the Turkish Grand Assembly.

The following day, Delegation members visited the Turkish Grand National Assembly (Turkish Parliament), which has 600 members and is located in Ankara, the capital city of Türkiye.

The Delegation joined a reception hosted by HE Halil Eldemir, the President of the Türkiye-Australia Interparliamentary Friendship Group, Member of Parliament for Bilecik. Other Parliamentarians also joined this reception.

We also attended the Turkish Parliament General Assembly Special Session for the Anniversary of Foundation of the Parliament and a guided tour. This coincides with National Sovereignty and Children's Day in Türkiye – a very significant day in Türkiye that celebrates democracy and the importance of young people.

Our final meeting at the Turkish Parliament was with HE Bekir Bozdağ, Deputy Speaker of the Turkish Parliament. We discussed opportunities to foster the relationship between Turkiye and Australia, including expansion of Turkish Airlines flights between our countries.

#### Conclusion

It is notable that from the fierce conflict between Australian and Turkish forces over the Gallipoli campaign, the relationship between our countries has now evolved to one of friendship and growing economic ties.

It was a great honour to walk the battlegrounds of the Gallipoli campaign, and to represent my local communities to lay a poppy and pay my respects at the graves of fallen local men.

To see firsthand the challenges of the landscape that the failed landing presented to young men in a strange land, who landed in the wrong location with known incredible risk ahead, was a humbling experience.

It is the courage of these brave Australian men that we will always remember.
