- Engage more deeply with companies developing electric public transport fleets for possible trial or collaboration.

The insights gained during this AI-focused delegation highlight the global scale and speed of technology development in China. The rapid deployment of AI in media, commerce, and transportation suggests urgent opportunities for Victoria to position itself as a forward-looking hub of innovation. The trip reinforced the importance of strategic investment in local entrepreneurship and innovation ecosystems, leveraging global learnings to drive economic and employment growth in Ringwood and beyond.
