#### Prisoners/Offenders in the system

- 3,940 male / 245 female = 4,185 prisoners \*
- 1,458 on parole (inc. Interstate & Commonwealth parole)
- 7,811 community corrections offenders (inc. parolees)




- **Staff** (Prisons, CCS, Head Office): 2,513 (FTE)




