


• Victoria's agricultural production is worth \$9.2 billion – or 23.9% of the Australian total






Overview



- Providing choice to farmers and consumers






The challenge of change

 - Demographic and land use changes





A new era for farming

- Farmers are facing unprecedented pressures and uncertainties
- At the same time, exciting new opportunities are emerging







Boosting productivity through new technology and changes in farming practices

\$103.5m to expand agricultural research, development and practice change services in Victoria



Understanding and managing climate change

\$11.5m to help farm businesses plan for climate change and provide farmers in key industries with new technologies and strategies to adapt their farming systems to future climate conditions



Strengthening land and water management

\$24m for managing weeds and pests, as well as new actions to assist farm businesses to strengthen land and water management







Helping farm families to secure their futures

\$12m boost for services to support farmers and rural communities in securing their future and adjusting to change



Developing new products and securing new markets

\$11m package of initiatives to help farm businesses capture new domestic and international market opportunities. This includes enhancing Victoria's biosecurity preparedness.
