
Achievements

- Introduced free public transport on Sundays for Seniors Card holders





 The population will continue to age significantly, with the age structure taking on a new shape:




Responding to the challenge

- A positive approach to ageing for seniors in Victoria
 - Go For Your Life Campaign encouraging seniors to be fit and well
 - Positive Ageing positive images of senior Victorians
- Developing community care
 - Implement Access Points help to find aged care services
 - Implement HACC Assessment Framework
 - Active Service Model improving quality of service provision by focussing on wellness, restoration and social connection.
- Facilitating Residential Aged Care in high need areas
 - Aged Care Land Bank LFS commitment to be completed.
- Redeveloping public sector residential aged care facilities
 - \$445.7 million committed since 2000 to rebuild more than 25% of public sector beds.

Portfolio budget

- Total Senior Victorians budget \$1.1 billion in 2008-09
 - Senior Victorians budget spread across three Output Groups: Aged and Home Care; Small Rural Services (DHS) and Seniors and Veterans (DPCD)
 - Increased by 6.7% or \$69.2m over 2007-08
 - Represents 75% increase since 1999-2000Growth in Portfolio 1999-00 to 2008-09



Budget Initiatives 2008-09

- Growth in funding for HACC in 2008-09 of \$11.0 million.
- Regional Food Kitchen
 - \$6.0 million Victorian Government grant for facility to be owned and operated by a consortium of local councils
 - will improve management, efficiency and cost effectiveness of producing meals for the HACC delivered meals services.
- Redevelopment of three aged care facilities for seniors \$66.6 million allocated for:
 - Kingston Centre Redevelopment Stage 2 \$45 million
 - Bendigo Residential Aged Care Facility (Stella Anderson Replacement)
 \$13.6m
 - Hepburn Health Service Trentham Campus Redevelopment \$8m
- Stage 3 of Aged Care Land Bank a further \$2.5m allocated

Budget Initiatives 2008-09

- \$2 million Men's Sheds Program
- U3As continuing the growth strategy
- Seniors 'Go for Your Life' continuing the rollout of healthy active living projects
- Strength Training
- Continuing positive ageing initiatives
