2007-08 Budget Commitments

Expand the supply and improve the quality of social housing

- Boost for public housing \$200m
- Investment fund \$300m
 - ➤ \$60m Labor election commitment to "Expand Affordable Housing Supply"
 - > \$240m to build housing sector sustainability

Homelessness assistance

- \$7.5m Support for Young People that Really Counts
- \$2.1m to lift homeless support standards

What we will deliver

- \$200m boost for public housing will deliver 800 public housing units over four years.
- \$300m investment fund will deliver 1,550 new social housing units over four years including:
 - **\$60m** to provide **230 new rental homes** for low income Victorian families and **120 new apartments** for single people;
 - **\$240m** to purchase or construct **1,200 homes**, to be owned and managed by Housing Associations.
- A further \$9.6m over four years to:
 - improve homelessness support services (\$2.1m) and
 - deliver a new service model to assist young people in housing crisis (\$7.5m).

What we will do

In 2007-08 approximately 1,150 new homes will be provided through:

- funding of \$100.4m for acquiring public housing;
- > \$90.7m in capital funds (provided to Housing Associations) to deliver more social housing; and
- >\$17.6m for redevelopments.

Developments announced to date:

Norlane - \$40m for 200 new homes and 100 upgrades.

Ballarat - \$12.5m for 50 new homes.


Bacchus Marsh - \$5.3m for the redevelopment of 20 homes.

Bendigo - \$7.5m for 30 units over the next 12 months.

Northcote - \$9m for the redevelopment of 47 homes at Roberts St.

Additional State funding for housing assistance


 The 2007-08 State Budget allocations provides a major injection to build on the significant investment in social housing already made under the Bracks Government.

 Additional State investment in housing by the Bracks Government has meant that more Victorians are getting the housing assistance they need.









Better quality housing

Investment in maintenance and physical improvements (\$2006-07 dollars)


