## A Fairer Victoria – Building on the Commitment

- An additional \$1.4 billion in A Fairer Victoria 2007 64 new initiatives
- \$3 billion total investment in A Fairer Victoria since 2005
- Priorities in 2007 include
  - Housing
  - Addressing the needs of people with a disability
  - Early childhood development
  - Helping older Victorians to stay independent
  - Indigenous affairs



# **DVC Strategic Directions**

- Increase opportunities for people to participate in the social, economic and civic life of their communities
  - Employment, skills development, volunteering, schools, councils, local committees, being active in their communities
- Focus efforts and resources to improve outcomes for specific population groups and places
  - Target investments to particular places and people groups –
    Community Renewal, Indigenous Framework
- Improve the way Government engages with citizens and communities
  - Making Government easier to work with grants
  - Citizen engagement



## 2006-07 major achievements

- Community Renewal \$11.5 million tackling place based disadvantage started in Frankston North, Laverton and Whittington
- Volunteering & Community Enterprise strengthened support services with \$7.3 million, exceeded 750 small grants, developed of 76 enterprises, created 140 jobs and trained 250
- Transport Connections \$8.3 million for 25 projects tackling transport disadvantage across the Victoria
- Community Building Initiative \$10 million for 19 projects in 102 towns over 3300 participants in workshops
- Community Support Fund \$366,750 for 18 Community Planning, \$1.2m for 11 Community Strengthening, \$8.7 million for 35 Community Infrastructure

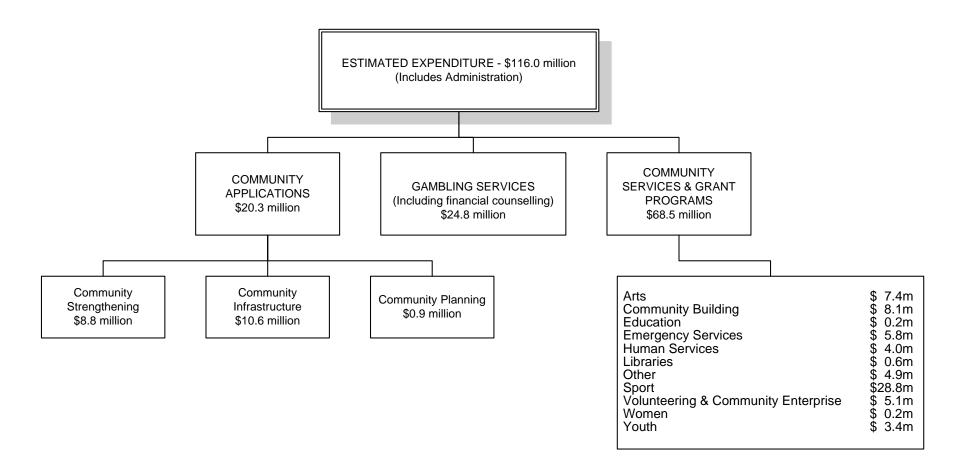


### 2007-08 budget initiatives – Victorian Communities

- \$61.2 million over four years to support community activities.
  - \$41.2 million for Victorian Community Support Grants
  - \$20 million to build and upgrade community centres
- \$4.4 million over four years to support volunteering
- \$1.6 million over four years for the Community Bus program
- \$3 million over four years for Community Enterprise
- \$4 million over four years for Community Renewal
- 1.6 million for an Electronic Document Management System (Asset)
