

Government policy context

- The Bracks Government has committed to:
 - Expanding the supply of affordable housing (Labor's Financial Statement 2, A Fairer Victoria);
 - Improving the quality of social housing (Melbourne 2030);
 - Reducing disadvantage in health, education and housing among communities (Growing Victoria Together 2); and
 - Delivering better services and support for homeless Victorians (A Fairer Victoria).

Challenges and priorities

CHALLENGES

Falling revenue

Changing housing market - increasing affordability problems

High cost of asset management - ageing stock

Changing client need - increasing complexity; homelessness; family violence; concentrations of disadvantage




2006-07 State Budget priorities

- \$8.84 million (\$28.77 million over four years) to enhance homelessness assistance through:
 - the Supported Accommodation and Assistance Program (SAAP) (\$13.81 million over four years); and
 - new and flexible initiatives targeted at young people (\$10.81 million over four years) and people with mental health issues (\$4.15 million over four years).
- \$50.5 million extra boost for social housing to:
 - expand the supply of affordable housing (\$25.5 million); and
 - enhance quality of public housing across the State (\$25.0 million).

Additional State funding for housing assistance

 The 2006-07 State Budget allocations continues the significant investment in housing assistance made under the Bracks Government.


Sources of funds for housing assistance

Long Term Housing Assistance






