A Fairer Victoria – Progress and Next Steps

- A year ago the government launched A Fairer Victoria with \$788 million of initiatives to address disadvantage in Victoria.
- Building on its success we have launched A Fairer
 Victoria Progress and Next Steps a further \$851.6
 million package of new initiatives.
- We have retained the five themes and 14 strategies
- Progress report shows we are making inroads into disadvantage



A Fairer Victoria – Progress and Next Steps

There are a number of additional focuses

- Stronger emphasis on addressing the needs of disadvantaged locations and growth areas.
- Prioritised the early years of a child's life
- Greater response to homelessness
- Support for flexible transport solution
- Increased access to services for multicultural communities.

DVC grants - leveraging investment

Case study -Victorian Community Support Grants:

- 2005-06 134 grant approvals totaling more than \$20 million have been approved
- Provides a significant base from which to leverage additional financial and in-kind investment

Community strengthening in action


Community strengthening: local people working with government to make a difference to their communities and improve the places in which they live

Case study - Caroline Springs

- Partnership between state government, Shire of Melton,
 Delfin Lend Lease and community organisations
- Supporting community to identify community needs and giving them a say in planning
- Linking facilities and services
- Across Melton Caroline Springs residents report the highest levels on the Community Strength Indicators

2006-07 New initiatives – Victorian Communities

- \$4.7 million to expand No Interest Loans Schemes (NILS) in Victoria.
 Increasing the number of NILS from 850 to around 3,800.
- \$18.3 million over four years towards the Flexible Transport Solutions initiative.
 - Supporting up to 30 projects in regional, rural and outer urban municipalities in 2006-07.
 - expansion of the Transport Connections Program
 - new, low-cost services and projects identified by local communities.
- \$7.5 million Community Renewal and Growing Communities
- \$3.5 million over two years for Better Facilities (revitalising RSL buildings, and redeveloping CFA stations)
