Question: ...Do you have any data on (1) calls you get about wildlife, road strike or displaced wildlife and (2) calls where an agency or a group like Wildlife Victoria or another rescue group might call on you?

Glenn WEIR: No. I could take those on notice...

Response:

(1) Victoria Police collects data on the total number of vehicle collisions involving "struck animal", broken down by animal type. The most recent data, from the Traffic Incident System (TIS) reports the following incidents of "struck animal" vehicle collisions requiring police attendance:

Victoria Police also collects Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) data in relation to Triple Zero calls dispatched to Victoria Police regarding other types of animal incidents, and these include:

- Code 521 for animal incidents attended by police only, such as dispatching
 injured animals, wandering or aggressive domestic animals or livestock, and
 welfare checks on animals (such as animals locked in vehicles).
- Code 522 for Ambulance incidents where police are notified, such as animal attacks when a person is injured.
- Code 589 for State Emergency Services (SES) incidents where police are notified, such as trapped animals (for example, livestock caught in a storm water drain).

Please note that the above event codes do not differentiate between incident types within codes, meaning that the data does not distinguish between welfare checks for animals and calls for police assistance to dispatch sick or injured animals, as both of these incidents would fall under code 521. Nor does the data distinguish animal type.

(2) In relation to the TIS and CAD data that Victoria Police collects in relation to calls to assist with animal incidents, this data cannot differentiate who made the call seeking assistance. Manual review of all relevant incidents would be required for Victoria Police to compile data on who has contacted Victoria Police for assistance with animal incidents.

CAD data is owned by Triple Zero Victoria and Triple Zero Victoria may be able to provide further high-level analysis of animal incidents.
