My husband works interstate and I am here on the farm alone the entire time. I'd be terrified if they came here.

Our farming practices saw us be the first beef enterprise in Australia to be recognised by the Aus Animal Humane Society, which basically means that our 100+ cattle are not chased, no dogs, no hitting or prodding and would be greatly effected by anyone they didn't know trying to deal with them in the normal manner as other farmers.

We have a closed herd and practice strong bio-security which includes not wearing off the farm footwear. Plus and most importantly, if I was confronted by them and was made to feel unsafe, my fight or flight instinct would probably see me take an axe to their skulls. I'd especially lose my cool if they touched any of my ladies.
