Seven city councils at next hearing on recycling and waste management

On Tuesday 22 October 2019, the parliamentary inquiry into recycling and waste management will hold a public hearing in Melbourne with evidence to be presented by seven city councils.

The city councils are Hobsons Bay, Port Phillip, Yarra, Banyule, Moreland, Boroondara and Darebin.

The Legislative Council's Environment and Planning Committee will also hear from the international anti-pollution organisation, IPEN via video link.

The public hearing will be held at 55 St Andrews Place, East Melbourne from 10:15 am to 4:00 pm and will be broadcast live on the Victorian Parliament's [website](#) enabling people across the state to view the discussions.

Under the terms of reference for the inquiry, the Committee is examining the Victorian government's waste management approach, the response to China's waste ban and solutions to the recycling and waste crisis, including reduction strategies.

It has received more than 700 submissions and has held public hearings in Melbourne, Morwell, Echuca and Dunkeld.
