It looks like the quantity and variety of waste are increasing at a very fast rate. Packaging and DIY are introducing new materials of unknown or possibly mixed dangerous elements, some of which could be recovered as recyclable for some industries. Householders are often confused as to which bin to place some materials in. Special stations are not always within easy reach and are miles apart. Because of inability to decide which of the present three bins should be used, it is possible that different people will use different bins for the disposal of the same material, thus compromising the specificity of each and every bin. Perhaps a fourth small bin should be provided (at a cost) for all materials that are of an unknown nature. This way only one of four bins will need to be sorted out and the other three, the great bulk of waste, can almost safely be considered to contain only what they are meant to contain and simplify greatly the final disposal operation with possibly sensible savings.
