The Chair person of the Recycling and waste management inquiry

Dear Sir/Madam,

1. Waste material should be burnt to create electricity. I believe there is a plant in Western Australia which does this. Waste is delivered, sorted, burnable waste is heated to remove the moisture which goes into the atmosphere from the only chimney. The remainder is burnt, the smoke filtered so clean air goes to the atmosphere and the heat generated produces electricity.
2. Companies handling waste appear to be set up so that funds received from accepting waste "disappears". This appears to be the case at Lara where the liquidator has no money so taxpayers have to pay the clean up costs which at Lara are estimated to be \$ 100 million. Companies handling waste should be required to be set up in a manner which prevents funds "disappearing" and be required to set money aside for restitution in a similar way in which I understand mining companies are required to do so.
3. We should not export our waste to other countries, we should process it ourselves.
